**TradMaD Camp Sat August 27 thru Friday Sept 2.** Location is Pinewoods Camp, Plymouth, MA. Organized by the Folk Music Society of New York it brings together traditional musicians and singers in an incredible supportive environment. The days are structured around both learning and participatory sessions, with ample time for informal singing and jamming, opportunities for dancing, two ponds for swimming, and wonderful food. Staff this year includes Margaret Bennett and John Krumm. Margaret is an international scholar, prizewinning author and singer, who is widely regarded as Scotland's foremost authority on folklore. Recently the SRSNH received a \$1,500 grant from the Benjamin W. Couch Trust for the purpose of continuing their guest workshop program. For example this spring Lissa Schneckenburger and Katie McNally are guest workshop leaders on April 24th and June 26 respectively. The Society has received grants from both the Benjamin and Gertrude Couch Trusts in past years. The Couch name goes back at least as far as the 18th century in the area, Benjamin Warren Couch, Jr. (1873-1945) was a graduate of Concord High School, Dartmouth College and Harvard Law School, and was a practicing lawyer and a member of the legislature. The SRSNH is grateful for the generosity and vision of the Couch Trusts and for the role of TD Wealth in carrying out the Trust's purposes.

The SRSNH has a Scholarship program to assist its members wishing to participate in learning experiences about Scottish music. These can include attendance at Scottish music schools, workshops or camps; expenses to study or research traditional music, including music lessons, etc. Deadline is April 22.

#### A Piper

As defined by Neil Munro in the Lost Pibroch, published 1931:

To the make of a piper go seven years of his own learning and seven generations before. If it is in, it will out, as the Gaelic Old-word says; if not, let him take to the net or sword. At the end of his seven years one born to it will stand at the start of knowledge, and leaning a fond ear to the drone, he may parley with old folks of old affairs. Playing the tune of the "Fairy Harp," he can hear his forefolks, plaided in skins, ...... or, trying his art on Laments, he can stand at the cairn of kings, ken the colour of Fingal's hair, and see the moonlight on the hook of the Druids!

## SDCEA is Here to Help – and has been for Almost 30 Years

The SDCEA (Scottish Dance & Cultural Education Association of Boston) is available to help cover part of the cost of dance or music events, if that would make a difference to your being able to attend. It was formed back in 1987 to provide financial assistance to dancers and dance musicians, making it possible for them to participate in Scottish dance and music events.

The funds come from memorial donations to honor members of the Scottish dance community, from the proceeds from an annual fundraising dance, and from individual donations. Most of the funding is designated for Boston Branch members, though some funds are available for use by non-Branch participants.

Over its 28-year history, more than \$48,000 have been awarded to 182 individuals to participate in dance camps/weekends/workshops or to attend teacher or music training workshops. Historically, roughly 75% of the funds have gone to Pinewoods participants, 17% for teaching or music workshops, and the rest for balls and other events.

#### **HOGMANAY** - some facts

[Taken in part from the January newsletter of the Highland Light Scottish Society of Cape Cod]

Hogmanay is the Scots word for the last day of the year; no one knows the exact origin of the word. It may be either from the Gaelic or Norman-French.

Following the establishment of the Scottish Presbyterian Church (ref. John Knox) celebration of Christmas in Scotland was considered a 'popish' activity, so instead the New Year became the traditional celebration in Scotland for the winter solstice. Family and friends would gather together for a party. 'The Bells' is the phrase to describe the moment when New Year's Eve becomes New Year's Day – that is the midnight hour. First Footing is the 'first foot' to enter the house after midnight and the custom is still very common in Scotland. To ensure good luck, a first footer should be a dark-haired male. Fair-haired first footers were not particularly welcome after the Viking invasions of ancient times. He would carry a lump of coal to place on the host's fire, and also shortbread or black bun, and whisky to toast a happy New Year.

Burns' *Auld Lang Syne* is sung to celebrate the start of the New Year at the stroke of midnight. The Guinness Book of World Records lists *Auld Lang Syne* as one of the most frequently sung songs in English/Scots.

An important element of Hogmanay celebrations is to welcome friends and strangers with warm hospitality, and to wish all a 'guid New Year.' The underlying belief is to clear out the vestiges of the old year, have a clean break and welcome in a young New Year on a happy note.

Heading east, we will stay at Auchterarder of *Ian Powrie's Farewell to Auchterarder* fame. From there, to Edinburgh for the Tattoo and *EH3 7AF* and as we head south we will take a picture of *Collie Law*.
