A VOICE FROM THE PAST

From a Talk by Dr. Milligan

The Music

... Half the battle in teaching Scottish Country dancing is to teach people the good tunes that express the spirit of the dance. Music makes the dancing. Teachers have a common fault - they never give to music one quarter of its importance. Teachers must educate the majority of dancers to music. We have gorgeous music, and we should encourage our classes to know the tunes. We should never use music for a well-known dance for another dance.

Teaching Technique

Technique gives you all the elegance in the world. Dancers who show elegant handing, smiling faces, uplifted heads – in short good technique – enjoy dancing and show this enjoyment. It is a pleasure to watch – the spirit is contagious. Scottish Country dancing should be natural – no fancy frills. Technique is taught to make the actual performance of SC dancing easier, to enable the dancer to enjoy it more and this enjoyment, in turn, is reflected in the dancing; it is gayer, happier – "controlled abandon." You never get a first-class performance if good footwork is absent.

Be sure your technique classes are useful and practical and teach something that will be incorporated into a dance to be danced that night. Don't allow your technique classes to be a "grind," to be boring; don't let your class feel it is hard work – let them enjoy it.

You must make technique classes interesting. Teaching technique to a long line is boring and dull. Keep your class lively and fun. Point out things – bring your class along point by point – build up your technique class. For example, the pas de Basque step, used in Poussette, used in such and such dance. Show them the purpose of learning this step – to enable them to dance the formation, and then to dance the dance ...

The Birks of Invermay and The Haydn Connection

(Not to mention the lesser-known personage and dance "Mrs. Hepburn Belches of Invermay".)

For over 300 years the Birks of Invermay has been a noted beauty spot near Perth, Scotland. Near there amidst the famous birch woods, the river Mey joins the river Earn, which flows into the river Tay, the Firth of Tay and North Sea. Such was the effect of these birks or birch woods that they inspired a local lad, William Malloch, to write the poem "The Birks of Invermay," which was published as a song in 1733. The song begins:

The smiling Morn, the breathing spring, Invite the tuneful birds to sing.
And while they warble from each Spray, Love melts the universal Lay, Let us, Amanda, timely wise, Like them improve the Hour that flies, And in soft Rapture waste the day, Among the Birks of Invermay.

I am not sure if Malloch's lyrics were sung to an existing tune, or if the tune was written for the poem, anyway the song was very popular in its day and was a favorite of the poet Robert Ferguson (1750-1774).

Now here is the Haydn connection! From 1792 to 1804 Haydn wrote 400 arrangements of Scottish and Welsh folk songs for various Scottish publishers such as Napier, Thompson and Whyte. Some of these arrangements were done during Haydn's London visits in the 1790s. Beethoven also wrote arrangements of Scottish, Irish and Welsh folk songs.

The "Birks of Invermay" was one of those works given to Haydn and he either improved on the original tune or wrote a new one. It appears that the Haydn version is the one that has come down to us today. Unfortunately, I can only find one recording of Malloch's poem sung to Haydn's tune and that is by Katrine Polwort in her CD "Fairest Floo'er."

But luckily for us Scottish country dancers the Haydn version of "The Birks of Invermay" can be heard on "The Bobby Frew Four" CD. Bob Harmon used Bobby Frew's "Birks of Invermay" and it is absolutely beautiful to listen and dance to; it is followed by three other marvelous old Scots melodies, "Jessie the Floo'er o' Dunblane", "Old Brig o' Ayr" and "Rose Amang the Heather." All are traditional songs arranged by Frew.

But what about "Mrs. Hepburn Belches of Invermay"? First of all it is a fast, challenging, and fun reel, requiring lots of pas de Basque, and it is named after a lady who died in 1833. At the time of her death, she was the relict (widow) of Lieutenant Colonel Hepburn Belches of Invermay. How it came to be the title of a breathtaking and physically demanding 48-bar reel I do not know. (*Note*: the devisor was John Bowie.) Renee Boblette and Bob Patterson introduced me to "Mrs. Hepburn" (the dance) at their Christmas Ceilidh last December. They use it to hone their students' pas de Basques.

This article is worth giving some thought to. We seem to be in such a hurry these days that it spills over into our dancing! One of the reasons to clear the floor after each dance is to allow the musicians to get ready for the next dance. The MC then waits until they are ready before calling for the next dance. Often one will see the musicians move new music onto their stands and the band leader may make a comment about the order of the tunes. The problem of not clearing the floor occurs in many other places as well. So relax, take your partner back to the sidelines, and then look for your next partner! — The Ed.

Clearing the Floor, by Christine Grobler

At many dances here in the U.S. our RSCDS counterparts in other branches practice the art of clearing the floor after every dance. I have recently had a wonderful trip up to Northern California and there I found, to my pleasure, it is so pleasant to be escorted off the floor at the end of a dance. Each time I come back home from a visit away, which usually includes dancing with other RSCDS Branches here and in the U.S. and around the world, I see how rushed we are in Orange County. We scoop up our partner for the next dance before we even think about clearing the floor. When I first started Scottish country dancing in 2006, I was very keen to abide by the rules and I remember reading that "one must clear the floor" after each dance. And only "when one hears the intro to the next dance, does one ask a new partner and walk onto the floor." It is not only forgetting our dance etiquette, it is maybe missing new dancers or visiting dancers who do not know how quickly we move from dance to dance. I know the reasons are that we have to get through all the dances before our hire time runs out for the hall. Would it be so sad to leave one dance off the program so that we do not feel so rushed? I would suggest slowing down a bit, get back to this wonderful, graceful part of our dancing, because after experiencing "clearing the floor," it is pure pleasure to regain one's breath and have a few minutes to look around to see who is available to dance with. Then it is such a joy to have a dancer come up to you to ask you to dance!
