

The Bobby Brown Music Apprenticeship

Bobby Brown (1941-2011) devoted his life to the playing, researching, recording, and teaching of Scottish Dance Music. As an individual performer, a member of two Scottish Country Dance Bands, the Musical Director of the internationally renowned fiddle troupe The Cape Breton Symphony, and the leader of The Scottish Accent, Bobby Brown was a leading proponent of Scottish Country Dance music and traditional Scottish music in Canada, the United States, Britain, and Europe for over fifty years.

In his memory, the annual *Bobby Brown Music Apprenticeship* was initiated in 2015 by the Teachers Association (Canada) to provide funding towards the cost for tuition, meals, and accommodation for one musician to attend one of the following:

- A music internship at TAC Summer School
- A music course at TAC Summer School
- A music course at a TAC-recognized Scottish Country Dance event

Flowers of the Forest

Ann Weston Miller grew up in the north of London, much of it during WWII. Ann qualified as a SCD teacher whilst studying at Dunfermline College for Physical Education teachers. Upon graduation, she first taught in the south of England, and later accepted a post with a girls' school in Jamaica. This was a very happy time of her life, she loved the climate and the people, and told numerous stories about their goings-on. In the 1960s she accepted a post at a girls' boarding school in Ashburnham, Massachusetts, and that was how she found the Boston Branch. I think we met at some function, maybe The English Speaking Union, and I invited her to stay for the Highland Ball. At that time it was held at the now non-existent Commodore Hotel, with Stan Hamilton and his SCD Band providing the music. She stayed several times and became a member of the Boston Branch although she also was a life member of the RSCDS. Ann taught in the Cambridge Class, the children's class I taught in Newton at the Grace Episcopal Church, and also occasionally for the Brookline Class. With her husband Donald they attended Pinewoods for a number of years as well as many other Branch functions. Latterly they moved to the historic area of Dorchester, where they could enjoy attending functions at the Museum of Fine Arts and music events in the city.

There was a goodly turnout of Scottish country dance members at her memorial service this spring. Her cheerful British voice is sadly missed. -EM

In Retrospect....

To my surprise I found that the class did not know who Bob Campbell was and that he devised the dance *Hamilton Rant*, when I was teaching it to the class. I shouldn't have been surprised really, but lest we forget such people it is good to recall them to mind. The Toronto Association (Branch) had an excellent article in their recent issue of *Set and Link* for April 2017, prompted by the passing of Bob's wife Dorothy. – *EM*

Bob Campbell (Robert MacIver Campbell) - Keith R. Bark

Last month we heard of the death of Dorothy Campbell, wife of Bob Campbell. Newer dancers are probably not aware that Bob Campbell was a prominent dancer, teacher, and dance devisor who lived in Oakville, Ontario. He passed away February 26th, 1993.

Bob was born in Toronto and claimed Scottish heritage through his great-grandparents. His great-grandfather was a physician in Edinburgh before emigrating to Upper Canada in the late 1830s. It is said that he was the first physician to administer chloroform in an operation in Upper Canada. *[continued on p 12]*

Bob started dancing in 1956 and gained his Teacher's Certificate in 1959 through the Hamilton Branch. Two of Bob's early dances were published in Book 22. This book was the first time the RSCDS devoted a complete book to modern devised dances. The first is Bob's *Hamilton Rant* with the tune *Dr. Bob Smith* written by J. Stanley Hamilton while Bob was a member of the Hamilton Branch, Ontario. The second dance is *The Middleton Medley* to the strathspey *Tarholm Brig* (by James McCroskie) and jig *Craighall* (by J. Stanley Hamilton). In later years he became a member of the Toronto Branch, and designed the Toronto Branch Shield. In 1970 he published his first book of dances, *Glasgow Assembly*, with sponsorship from the Toronto Branch. His second book of dances, *Farewell My Fancy*, was sponsored by The Teachers' Association (Canada) and published after his death.

Bob wrote over 40 dances, which may be a large number, but seven were published by the RSCDS and many more are popular all over the world. Some non-RSCDS dances of Bob's that we dance here [in Toronto], are *Davy Nick Nack*, *The Australian Ladies*, *Bonnie Stronshiray*, and *Riggs of Corn*, to name some of my favourites. – *Set and Link*, Toronto Branch

Ideas worth thinking about.....

While on the subject of Toronto, they host two annual dances which are brilliant in helping people become a part of their group. The first is a <u>Beginner's Dance</u>. This year they had 27 beginners, and a total of 127 attending. Dances on the program were straightforward such as *Le Papillion* and *De'il Amang the Tailors*. As one would expect at any SCD function there was 'a sumptuous spread at the interval.' The stirring music of Scotch Mist kept us all wanting more dancing and 'once again, please.'

The second is their 13th annual Youth Ball. All dancers aged 10-35 are invited for this year's ball. They will enjoy the fabulous music of Fred Noyes who played at the 2004 Youth Ball. He was quite moved that night when two young dancers, Gavin and Rhodes, came up afterwards to shake his hand and thank him for the fine music. There is a reception followed by dinner and then the dancing. The program may be found at www.dancescottish.ca Obviously situations are different at the many RSCDS Branches, but it is the germ of an idea that then is adapted to suit the local situation that is behind this article. In order to attract new dancers we do have to think outside the box, corny as that cliche is! Another event they have is a Beginner's tea at a member's home. – *EM*

Tartan Day Trivia.....

In the United States Tartan Day is celebrated on April 6th, the anniversary of the signing of the Treaty of Arbroath in 1321 by the earls and barons of the time on behalf of their king Robert the Bruce who had sent the English King Edward II's army out of Scotland at the battle of Bannockburn and following several other battles as well. This news bite is taken from the March 2017 issue of Set and Link, the newsletter for the Toronto Association. — EM

Australia and some other countries celebrate Tartan Day on July 1, the anniversary of the repeal of the Dress Act of 1746 which banned the wearing of tartan. The ban on tartan was part of an attempt to deter rebellion and bring warring clans under government control.

The word "tartan" dates back to ca. 1500 but its origin is unclear. Tartan may also mean a small one-masted vessel, a long covered carriage, an Assyrian commander-in-chief, or a kale and oatmeal pudding.

The oldest known tartan is the Falkirk tartan which dates to around AD245, and was discovered in a jar of coins near Falkirk.

The first colour photograph, taken in 1861 by James Clerk Maxwell, was of a tartan ribbon.

The only tartan to have been to the moon was a piece of MacBean tartan, taken on board Apollo 12 in November 1969 by Alan Bean, the fourth man to walk on the moon.

In 2004, a tartan was designed to honor the King of Rock'n'Roll's north-east of Scotland roots. Elvis Presley's roots trace back to tiny Lonmay in Aberdeenshire. The official Presley of Lonmay comprises four colours — blue, grey, green and yellow.



RSCDS Grant from the Patron's Fund

The money was raised through contributions from a wide variety of donors. One of these was a long-time dancer with the Hunter Valley Branch, Australia, Ros McKie. The money will be used by the RSCDS to improve their technology/video conferencing facility, where it is hoped it will improve contact with members, teachers, Branches and Affiliated groups world-wide. Ros has visited a number of branches in her travels as well as being known in Australia, so she was an excellent choice to represent the overseas dancing community.
