### **A Country Dance**

Originally from the Journal of the Law Society of Scotland. The article was reproduced with the kind permission of the editor of the Journal in the 1959 issue of The New Zealand Country Dancer. [Who would have imagined that our learned friends of the legal profession would fall victims to the charms of Scottish Country Dancing? Nell MacKinnon, well known to dancers in Christchurch, N.Z. and, with her husband and daughter, are regular attendees at summer schools, has unearthed the following gem. – Ed.]

Those of us who have friends in country dance clubs may have been rather intrigued to find how seriously the hobby is taken by its adherents, but on further reflection it becomes apparent that this is no more than the due of an art steeped in history, local custom, and colour.

Recently I had the good fortune myself to come across one such collector's piece on a tattered sheet of paper, which gives a glimpse of the gayer, brighter life in a Scottish county town in the good old days. While it may not be of sufficient interest to merit the attention of the general body of country dancers, it might be that the local authority branch of the profession in one of the more cultured county towns, could arrange to have the dance performed at the crownings of the town queen, or some other gala occasion. I leave that decision to their wise discretion, but hope the dance may prove of interest to the legal profession generally, and stimulate their efforts to preserve such items of historic interest from oblivion.

The following is a transcript of the manuscript as far as decipherable, viz:

### THE FOUR MEN UNDER THE STEEPLE, or, WHAE'S FOR AWA' TAE THE JUG?

Note: This dance is to be performed with gay abandon and considerable choreographic licence by a sheriff and his clerk, along with a fiscal and his depute, accompanied by a chorus of law agents.

**Tunes:** Lord Advocate's Fancy, or, The County Vigilantes

### Description:

The sheriff leads the fiscal down the middle, holding hands, and then leads him back again.

The fiscal faces up to the sheriff, then passes him right by the cold shoulder.

The clerk dances three hands round with the depute, then they set to each other.

The sheriff casts up one place, double-crosses the fiscal, and casts out.

The fiscal repeats the movement and is cast down.

The clerk and depute face in opposite directions, and the chorus shuffles, and looks sideways.

The sheriff and fiscal skip alternate bars while the clerk and depute turn into the others, all finishing ready for "double triangles."

Repeat, having passed a couple, till all are cast down, and pass out, and the chorus ends up in grand chains."



Country dancing does not seem to have done more than infiltrate across the border. Even in 1775 it was struggling hard against the native reels. Edward Topham writes in *Letters from Edinburgh*, "The perseverence which the Scotch ladies discover in these reels is not less surprising than their attachment to them in preference to all others. They will sit totally unmoved at the most sprightly airs of an English country dance, but the moment one of these tunes is played ... up they start, animated with new life, and you would imagine they had been bit by a tarantula."
