News from the Teaching and Music Committee

Greetings from TMC, the Teaching and Music Committee for the Boston Branch. We have been meeting monthly to ensure the smooth running of favorite Branch events including, but not limited to, the May Highland Ball and Scottish sessions at Pinewoods. Additionally, next month (April) is NEFFA, and we are delighted that Jennifer Schoonover, Charles Liu, Howard Lasnik, and Karen Sollins will all represent the Branch, teaching various Scottish workshops, so be sure to look for them on the schedule. Planning for the Ball and for Pinewoods are both going well, and we hope to introduce more workshops as events once again return to "inperson."

One especially interesting item this past February was discussion of possible submissions for the RSCDS Book 53, which called for "locally popular dances" to be submitted by the Branches. The committee voted overwhelmingly in favor of submitting "Pinewoods Reel" with the title tune "The Tushkar." Not only does our Branch do this dance frequently, but the dance itself recalls the event at which we welcome our dance and music friends from around the world. Chris Dickson, John Bowie Dickson's widow, and Kenny Cooper, Ron Cooper's son, were delighted to give their permissions for publication of this dance and tune, and it was delightful to be in touch with them. We also considered several favorite jigs and ultimately decided to submit "Burns Night," a very popular, frequently danced jig devised by our own Robert McOwen, a long-time respected and important contributor to our Branch. Moreover, the title tune to this dance (of the same name) was written by Barbara McOwen, one of the most influential musicians and bearers of tradition in our community. The dance and tune commemorate the 18 years that the Boston Branch presented a sparkling celebration of Robert Burns in the historic Sanders Theater. For a strathspey, we submitted "Anna's Wedding Cake" by Brenda Janssen, on the recommendation of the Albany Class. This flowing dance is partnered with a traditional tune for its title tune.

We look forward to meeting again as we approach some big events and remain optimistic that springtime will bring sunshine, fresh air, and a new "new normal." – *Respectfully yours, Debbie Jarvis, Chair of TMC*

Applications are already pouring in as prospective campers look forward to dancing with old friends and new beneath the pines. Applications received by April 1st will share equal weight in the lottery (if we receive more applications than available camper spots), and those submitted after the 1st or that aren't chosen in the lottery will be waitlisted. Out of Your Depth

By Heinz Duewell, 1985, via Evelyn Murray

[Heinz was a RSCDS teacher in Hunter Valley Branch, N.S.W., Australia. He was a teacher's teacher. He thought about the hows, whys, etc in his great love of SCD. Sadly no longer with us but his words survive.]

Mastery of basic figures combined with good technique will enable you to do any dance. There will be minor problems in phrasing and the linking of formations. Change of feet, by which I do not mean wanting to swap feet with someone else's, may be required. So here is something different to be learnt and practiced and applied. It is sad that many dances are not so popular because often people are lazy and not prepared to spend the necessary time to become proficient in these areas. One must know the basics before becoming an "expert."

Another feature that marks out the good dancer is his/her knowledge of a fair repertoire of dances, though that derives largely from experience and not only from deliberately memorising them. Couple with this is a feeling for the apace required to perform a dance satisfactorily. Just watch a good set instinctively adopting the right size for a known dance. Dancers will look at each others as eye contact is a great help in phrasing and in indicating readiness to start a formation. If people are not looking at you you then most likely they would not be ready to dance with you at the appropriate moment in the dance.

Once basics have been thoroughly assimilated you'll be prepared to try some elaborations, unusual combinations and even entirely new figures. Some dances present a real challenge to the mind. They may excel in a highly symmetrical pattern or they may be structured as a fugue with every couple doing something different, but the whole superbly integrated. At that stage you are ready for an advanced class where you work on phrasing and performing ability of even the simplest of dances. Steps are perfected so that changes are managed with consummate ease and your appearance as a dancer will belie all the hard work that has gone before. Also your mind will be sharper and you will experience that exquisite feeling of satisfaction when giving a superb performance of a difficult demonstration dance. You really have arrived!
