

#### Did You Know?

by Freeland Barbour in his book The White Rose of Gask, via Evelyn Murray

Songs by Carolina Oliphant, Lady Nairne, are still sung today. Some of them had become popular throughout Great Britain and North America during the second half of her life, but her name as an author was kept well hidden as a result of her own inclinations and instructions. Partly because of this she has never been accorded the same limelight so rightly enjoyed by Robert Burns, both during his own lifetime and thereafter. Unlike Burns she did not die young. And she came from a relatively privileged background, nor did she write such a range of works of genius as Burns, but she is without doubt second only to him in that period as a writer of Scots songs.

### Tales from Pinewoods

Julie and I managed to flip it right-side up, but it had a lot of water in it. We tried again, and had a little less water inside, so I climbed in to try to bail out the water. However, as quickly as I could bail, more water was coming in over the side. We thought it might be better if Julie, being lighter, were the one trying to bail out the water. But just then we saw Jason Beals and Jen Schoonover approaching in a another canoe: they had been watching the drama from the dock and were coming to our rescue! The only solution was for Jason and Jen to tow the water-laden canoe back to the dock as Julie

and I swam. I was wearing a life-vest (required for taking out a canoe), so I couldn't do a crawl stroke; the only way I could make progress was using backstroke. Needless to say, Julie beat me back to the dock (which, truth be told, she would have done even if I had not had the life-vest on), and then we waited for the arrival of our flooded canoe. In shallow water it was a simple matter to invert the canoe and drain the water, making it seaworthy again. We thanked our saviors, then Julie went off to finish packing and I went to dry off before driving to the airport. An exciting way to start the day!
