

Patron of the RSCDS - H.M. The Queen

Her passing has left a hole. Especially in the lives of people whom she was the only Queen they knew. Certainly, for me it is difficult to accept that she is no longer in her castle, whether it was Windsor or Balmoral. However, change is good for us all, as we welcome the new King and Queen.

A question I have been asked over the years is – does the Queen dance? – what in this context is meant of course is "Did Her Majesty dance Scottish country dances?" The answer is strongly in the affirmative as she and her sister, Princess Margaret, clearly attended lessons for SCD when they were children. The reason I know this as a fact is because a teacher at the boarding school I attended in the early fifties belonged to a school in London and knew the teacher that taught the two Princesses. This is not surprising as her mother, Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother had been born in Scotland at Glamis Castle and it is obvious that she had attended such classes as a child so would consider it quite normal to have her children similarly taught. As confirmation of this I am reminded of a visit to the Queen Mother's own home, Castle Mey. In the living room was a gramophone together with a box of LP records with familiar titles – Jimmy Shand, Jimmy Blair, etc. These items were not tucked away somewhere, they were obviously in a position which indicated regular use. Stories by local people also confirmed this. Guests to dinner were expected to stay afterwards for some Scottish dancing.

The Queen together with The Duke of Edinburgh and a group of dancers attended the Society's 50th Anniversary Ball, which was held in Glasgow. Julie Smith attended that event and reported her experience in a previous Tartan Times. The photograph accompanying this article was taken at the Centenary Ball of the Royal Scottish Pipers Society with the Queen and Duke dancing the Eightsome Reel, in Edinburgh, 2nd July 1982.

It was the Queen's father George VI who assented to being Patron of the Scottish Country Dance Society late in his reign in 1951. The title of the Society formed by Miss Milligan (et al) thus changed to Royal SCDS. This explains why the Boston Branch's original title for the Society was SCDS Boston Branch as the Corporation papers were signed in April, 1950. Upon ascending the throne when her father died February 1952 the Queen continued to be Patron of the RSCDS. Every year at the AGM of the Society greetings from Her Majesty were read out to the attendees.

It is our hope that King Charles will continue as the Society's Patron.

Miss (Dr.) Milligan said on a number of occasions that SCD was for everyone whatever their status, whether they lived in a black house or a castle. I have danced in a very crowded village hall up in the hills as well as in the ballroom at Blair Castle. On all occasions fellow dancers were cheerful, enjoying themselves and having fun. I would guess that the Queen enjoyed SCD too.



Addendum from the Assistant Editor: When our band Tullochgorum played for the Jeannie Carmichael Ball in New York last weekend, which always begins with the three national anthems, I felt a certain electric sensation around the room as most of us (all of us?) sang "God Save the King" for the first time in our lives.
