

WELCOME TO PINEWOODS!

Pinewoods Camp is owned and operated by Pinewoods Camp, Inc., a non-profit corporation which rents the camp facilities to groups sponsoring traditional dance and music programs. Part of your fee is paid to Pinewoods Camp, Inc., for your room, board and use of the facilities.

PLEASE NOTE:

Leave your room clean, swept and ready for the next camper.

The land surrounding Pinewoods is private property, including the area beyond the C# pavilion. Please try not to stray into these areas.

Crew cabins are located behind the Lads cabins, next to The Fine Companion, and on the shore below Headington and Grenoside. Please respect the privacy of the crew; try not to wander into the crew housing areas, and be quiet in their vicinity at night.

FOR YOUR CONVENIENCE:

SHOWERS: Are located next to the Pinecones garage, opposite the Fine Companion, opposite Hunsdon House, at the end of Pineneedles, and at the end of Royton near Square 12.

FIRST AID ROOM: Is located opposite the Manager's office (behind the public phones). It is stocked with basic first aid items only. Aspirin, etc. can be purchased in the Camp Store. There are instant ice packs in the dance pavilions - if you use one, please replace it from the stock in the First Aid room.

TELEPHONES: Telephones for camper use are on the left hand side of the Program Center porch. Both phone booths also have jacks for modem use. Local calls (and 911 calls) are free; other calls require a calling card. **No messages are taken at these phones.** Messages for campers may be left at 508-224-1430 (or, during CDSS sessions, at 508-224-3480). We do have cell phone access.

MAIL: Outgoing mail may be placed in the white mailbox at the end of the user group office porch - it is picked up in the morning by the grounds crew.

CAMP STORE: In the octagonal building opposite the Manager's office. Drinks, snacks, ice, flashlights and other sundries are for sale. During adult sessions the camp store is open 24 hours on a self-serve basis. During family sessions it is open several times each day - check your program schedule.

LOST AND FOUND: Is located in the green trunk in the Camphouse near the door facing Ampleforth. Valuable items should be left with either the Manager or the program administrator.

EMERGENCIES:

Medical

Telephone numbers and directions to Jordon hospital and Bourne Bridge Medical clinic are posted in the telephone booths and First Aid Room. Please notify designated First Aid Person of all injuries and medical incidents as soon as possible.

Fire

Water buckets and hoses are clearly labeled and located close to every cabin. In the event of a forest fire, campers will be notified by the Dining Hall and Program Center bells (and possibly siren). Please do not attempt to exit camp via Cornish Field Road unless notified to do so. We recommend that you gather at the beach at Long Pond or Round Pond.

Radiological

Campers will be notified by a loud, distinctive siren if there is an emergency at the local Pilgrim Nuclear Power Plant. You are advised to take shelter in the Camphouse and close all windows and doors.



PINEWOODS CAMP, INC. REGULATIONS

These regulations are for the safety and comfort of our campers and our neighbors, and for the preservation of the delicate camp environment. Please read them and abide by them.

1. **DANCE PAVILIONS:** To maintain the quality of the dance floors, no food or drink is permitted inside the pavilions. Please do not dance in the same shoes you wear to walk around camp. If you must wear the same shoes, brush them off very carefully before entering the pavilions. Grit on shoes damages the floors.

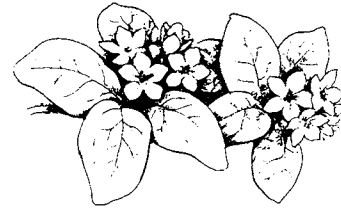
2. **AMPLIFIED SOUND AND LATE NIGHT NOISE:**

Sound travels very easily across the ponds. For the sake of our neighbors:

- a. **After 11 pm**, end the activities in C# and turn off amplified sound.
- b. **After midnight**, move all dance and music activities indoors (this means off porches), with doors and windows closed.

3. **ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AND DRUGS:**

The illegal use or sale of alcohol or drugs is prohibited.
The legal drinking age in Massachusetts is 21.



4. **FIREARMS:** Firearms are prohibited.

5. **PETS:** Pets are not allowed.

6. **SMOKING:** **Smoking is prohibited on camp paths, in the woods, and in camp buildings.** Smoking is permitted only at the bench across the lawn from the dining hall and at the bookstore end of the cement wall in front of the camphouse. Ashes must be deposited in the butt cans at these locations. The danger of fire in this area is very great.

7. **ELECTRICITY:** Turn out lights if you are the last to leave a building. Avoid the use of heat-producing appliances (such as hair dryers). If you must use one, use them only in places designated by the Manager or Grounds Crew. The first aid room and the new Headington showers are two places such items may be used. If there is a power failure, please use the outhouses.

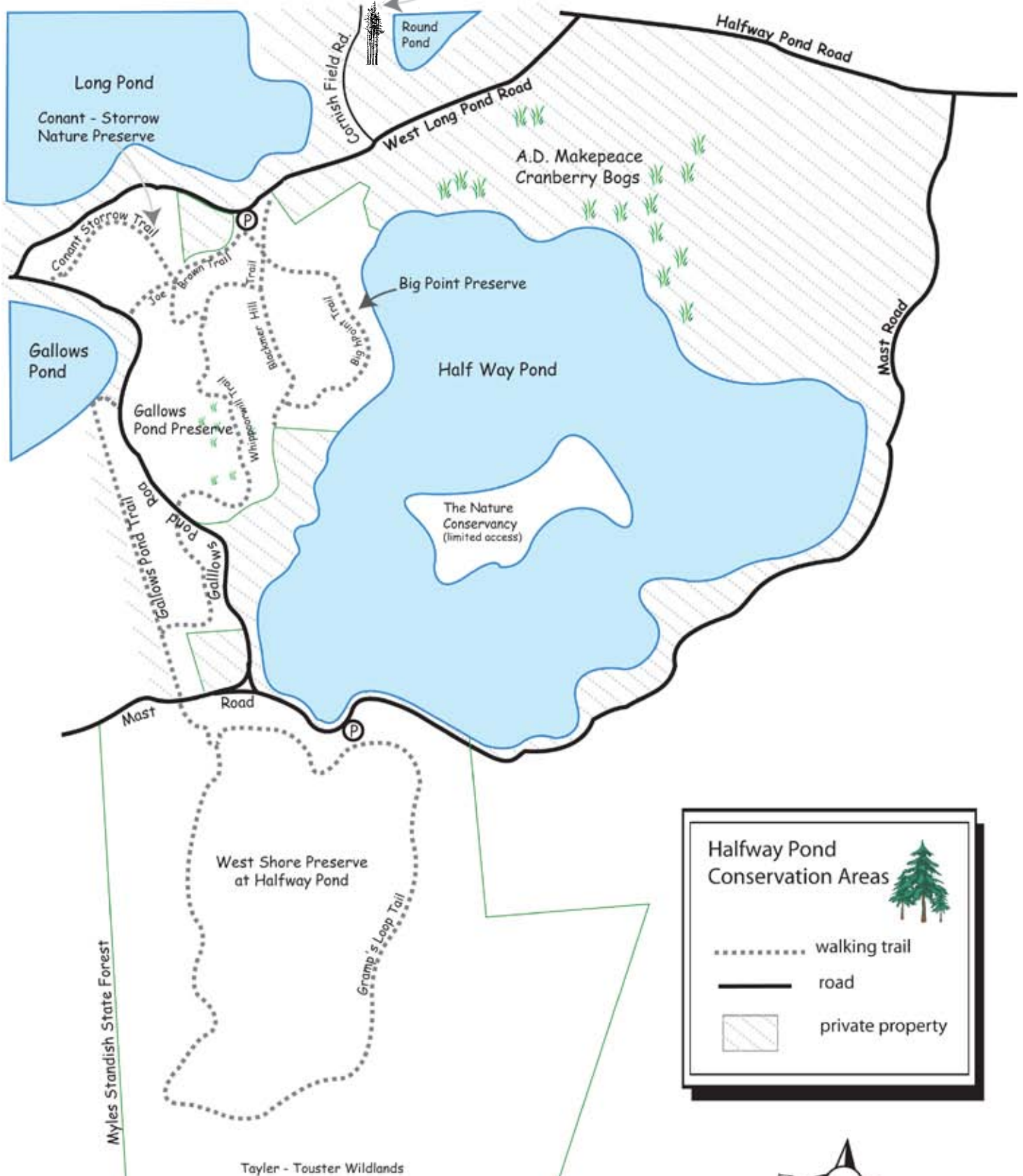
8. **AUTOMOBILES:** Pinewoods is a very fragile environment. Keep cars in their assigned spots, and do not drive them around camp.

9. **ENVIRONMENT:** Stay on the designated paths. Do not use soap or shampoo in the ponds. Please try to limit your water usage - particularly the length of showers.

10. **WILD ANIMALS:** Do not feed them (including the fish). Please be sure cabin doors are latched at all times so racoons will not come in and explore your cabin. Empty cabin wastebaskets in the morning.

11. **WATERFRONT:** Pinewoods does not assume responsibility for campers swimming, using the boats, or needing medical attention. Follow the instructions of the lifeguard, and obey all Pinewoods Camp, Inc. Waterfront Regulations (posted in the bathrooms).
