- vii.Each evening dance was split thirds

- ix. Evals were mostly positive

## x. Budget

- 1. Looked like shortfall of ~\$132 but they might've missed a scholarship
- 2. Had more scholarships than usual this year, to make camp more financially accessible
- 3. Have been approached by folks looking to donate to a scholarship fund so are looking into that for the future

## g. Scottish Sessions Pinewoods (Guest: **Debbie**)

- iv. General attendance was down. Wondering about covid protocols, but noticed that ESC was more strict and almost sold out.
- v. A variety of terminology was used by MCs and accepted by all.
- vi. Very little "drama" this year.

  - 2. Catherine Queen part time doing 1 step
  - 3. Jeanne Moody full time doing 2 SCD
  - 4. Jodi Kulas was excellent MC this year, will be staff next year full time doing 2 SCD. Her wife made the highland coo artwork that Thom bought for a million dollars, aww!
  - 5. Likely Jen as part-time to do Conditioning (not yet confirmed)s
  - 6. Next year music director is Catherine Miller Leaning on Susie and Debbie for support
  - 7. Hopeful for Hanneke in 2025 (for 100th anniversary at Pinewoods) She does want to come back, but scheduling meant she couldn't do 2024
